The Agony and Frustration of Budget Season

BUDGETS. On the surface, it is a simple concept. Figure out your needs, and maybe a few of your wants, and calculate how you will pay for them. You balance income and expenditures, and in the end, you hope they equal out or maybe even have a little left over on the income side in case something unexpected comes up. Families wrestle with it all the time and so do governments, big and small. Every year is a struggle, but this year has been particularly frustrating. As Diane Miller, Oriental Town Manager put it, "it is like shooting arrows at a moving target." One of the complicating matters of this year's budget is the fact that it comes in a year where properties in the county are undergoing a revaluation. Not all, but much of the county revenue is derived from ad valorem taxes. Ad valorem is a Latin term meaning "according to value." Property is assessed, a value is placed on it, and owners of that property are charged a percentage of that value to fund local governments. That percentage is commonly known as a tax rate and is usually based on an amount per \$100 value of property. Many municipalities use property values

that are determined by the county to set their own tax rates. We could write many words debating the fairness of this system. Ad Valorem taxes date back to ancient civilizations, and I think it is safe to say that Egyptians in the year 3000 BC didn't like paying the Pharaoh either. Property taxes have been likened to paying rent to the government to use something you already own. Revaluation of county property occurs every six years and 2026 is the year for it. Good or bad, fair or not, property values have risen sharply in this revaluation. Property owners have a right to appeal their value, and many are. Until the final values are set, the County finance office works off of the projections of those values to determine the tax rate to generate the revenue needed by the county to operate. There have been widespread complaints about property valuations not just in Pamlico County, but all over the state. This has prompted the North Carolina General Assembly to enact legislation (SB 889) that puts a one-year moratorium on all new property valuations. This affects roughly twelve counties who were undergoing revaluations this year, including Pamlico. But wait, maybe not. The General Assembly granted an exemption to counties

Ferry Tolls are on the Horizon

Ferry riders crossing the Neuse or Pamlico Rivers may soon be paying a fee to do so. Ferry tolls are once again being proposed in the North Carolina Legislature which include a possible rate hike on ferries that already have tolls and adding tolls to those which currently have no charge to use. All this comes on the heels of possible cutbacks in ferry services due to high fuel costs. Of the seven passenger car ferries operated by the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), four have no tolls including both the Neuse River ferry connecting Pamlico County with Craven County and the Pamlico River ferry connecting the north and south sides of Beaufort County. Opponents of adding tolls to these ferries have long argued that a large percentage of drivers who use these routes are daily commuters traveling to and from work or conducting commerce. Both ferries are a part of NC Hwy 306. Pamlico County Commissioner Ken Heath has fought the tolls every time they have been proposed in the legislature and last Wednesday, he traveled to Raleigh where he met with, among others, Senate Transportation Committee Co-Chair Vickie Sawyer and NC House Transportation Committee Co-Chair Frank Iler. Heath is not optimistic about defeat-

ing the tolls this time around. "I think it is pretty much a foregone conclusion that ferry tolls will be implemented. How much and how soon is the only question." NCDOT ferry officials have been given instructions to formulate a schedule of fees to come up with a specified amount of dollars for the division. This would involve adding and raising ferry tolls. In addition, House Bill 1094 calls for a performance audit of the Ferry Division. There is a ray of hope however for residents who use the ferries to commute. "We have been speaking with committee members about coming up with some sort of exemption for local users of the Neuse River Ferry," says Heath. "They (Committee members) seem to be at least open to that idea." What form that exemption may take remains to be seen. It could go so far as to exempt all residents of connected counties. In the case of the Neuse River Ferry, that would be Pamlico and Craven. It could also be limited to those who use the ferry truly to commute back and forth to work. Or there could be no exemptions. "Whatever they come up with, my guess is that it is implemented by the beginning of next year," says Heath. We will continue to urge those making the decisions to consider those who use the ferry on a daily basis as a work commuter."

High School Doors at the Heritage Center

At the recent "Last Walk" event, alumni, former teachers, and staff took a final tour of Pamlico County High School, one of the most popular stops in the hallowed halls were the bright yellow doors that any visitor to the walk were encouraged to sign. At Jim’s request there will be no funeral or memorial services.

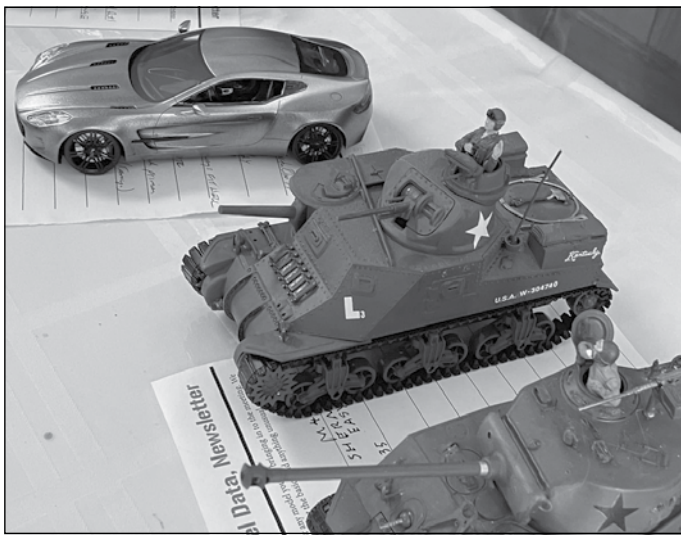

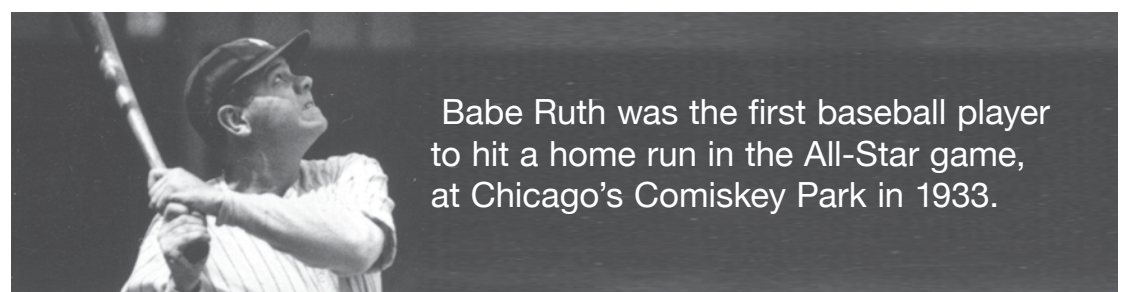

FINANCIAL FOCUS

Four stages of raising confident, money-smart kids

Good financial habits are a little like brushing your teeth. When you learn them early, they become second nature, and you carry them with you for life. And while money can feel complicated, especially today, the foundation starts simply.

Parents can begin the conversation with very young children, and young adults can build on those basics as they take on more responsibility. Step by step, these habits create confidence that helps build longterm financial security and a more fulfilling life.

The following are the four key stages of financial growth.

Stage 1: For very young children, the goal is to make money feel simple and manageable. A great place to start is with three jars labeled “Spend,” “Save” and “Share.” When kids can actually see their money grow or shrink, the idea starts to make sense. Saving also introduces them to goalsetting, and working toward paying for a small toy or outing teaches patience. Most important, you’re helping your children see money as a tool they can understand easily and use with confidence.

Stage 2: If you have tweens (children roughly 9 to 12 years old), they’re usually ready for slightly bigger financial ideas. This is a great time for them to earn money through chores or small jobs, helping them see the connection between effort and reward and building a sense of ownership. Conversations about needs versus wants also become more meaningful, because kids are now making real choices with money they earned themselves. Your tween

may be ready for a simple savings account to watch their savings grow, or a reloadable cash card for spending.

Stage 3: By the time teens reach high school or young adulthood, budgeting becomes essential. This doesn’t need to be overly strict or complicated. A simple system that helps them track deposits and withdrawals can make all the difference. Whether they use an app, a paper notebook or a spreadsheet, the real goal is awareness. Teenagers also benefit from learning how credit works. Understanding how to build a healthy credit score and how to use credit wisely protects them from costly mistakes in later life.

Stage 4: Then come the early working years, when habits shift from learning to building. One of the smartest steps at this stage is paying yourself first. Automatic transfers to savings or retirement accounts help establish stability without extra effort. Even small retirement contributions matter more than most people realize, because time allows compounding to do the heavy lifting. This is also when young adults can start organizing their money into different buckets for rent, automobile payments, emergencies, retirement and everyday spending. These habits help lay the groundwork for financial freedom down the road.

We were so excited this year to have our second annual 4H Dairy Project and show! Ms. Kristi Welke our tri-county livestock agent worked very hard to bring this opportunity to Pamlico County. Our 4-H Dairy Project started April 8th. For the last eight weeks our youth have been learning all about dairy calf husbandry. Through hands on experience, they have been responsible for feeding, cleaning, and training the calves. They have learned the proper way to show a dairy heifer, the breed standards of Holstein cattle, and the most desirable traits in dairy cows. They have worked hard to master showmanship skills and train their calf to perform.

The Agony and Frustration of Budget Season

with populations under 15,000 which included Pamlico. Work on the new budget would proceed based on 2026 property valuations. After line-by-line examination of proposed figures, Pamlico County generated a proposed budget of a little over \$30 Million and based on 2026 property valuations, a tax rate of .52 per \$100 was set in order to achieve a balanced budget. This rate was of course lower than last year’s rate of .645 that was based on lower property values. A proposed budget and tax rate, with a public hearing scheduled all before the June 30 deadline to get it done. Not so fast. A new bill (SB 474) introduced at the General Assembly on June 10, lowers the population exemption from 15,000 to 12,000. This puts Pamlico County back in the moratorium if passed. The bill has passed the Senate and is scheduled for a first vote in the House on June 16. Revenue would then have to be based on property values set in 2020. The Board of Commissioners called a special meeting last Friday to get an update from the County Manager and discuss their options. To attain a balanced budget based on the 2020 values, the tax rate would have to increase to .775 per \$100. Commissioners expressed frustration over the timing of the legislation as well as the lack of communication from those representing Pamlico County in the General Assembly. “It would have been nice to have been contacted by Senator Sanderson or Representative Kidwell to at least give us a heads up that this was coming,” stated Commissioner Ed Riggs. “I hate to say I’m mad, but I’m very disappointed that none of us received any communication about this new legislation.” Senator Sanderson is a cosponsor of the Bill. There was also concern that these legislative actions are a foreshadowing of further interventions by the state in the county budget process in the future. “These people can’t do their own budget,” said Commissioner Candy Bohmert, “and now they want to tell us how we should do ours.” County Manager Mark Brewington expressed concern to the Board that the issue would remain unresolved in the legislature past the end of the month. Faced with this uncertainty, the Board gave instructions to the County Manager and Finance Officer to prepare an interim month-to-month budget. Manager Brewington expressed that this would be his recommendation and that it is in line with recommendations by the North Carolina Council of Governments. He also stated that a final moratorium budget would have to be done by September. Pamlico County residents who had hoped to avoid a tax increase through the moratorium on property valuations may be disappointed. It could come down to a “pick your poison” situation. Would you rather pay more taxes because your property value is higher or pay more because the tax rate is higher. Monday’s (June 15) public hearing on the budget was rescheduled for June 29.

The Association of Community Health Nursing Educators held their national conference on June 3-6 in Spokane, Washington and Lynn Hardison, Clinical Services Director for the Pamlico County Health Department, attended and made a presentation titled "From Barriers to Bridges: Telehealth Partnerships in Rural Communities." The presentation highlighted how academic and community partnerships can expand access to healthcare services through telehealth, particularly in rural and underserved areas. "I attended the conference representing both Duke University School of Nursing, where I serve as an Adjunct Instructor, and Pamlico County as a rural community partner. The opportunity allowed me to share the successes, challenges, and lessons learned from our collaborative telehealth initiatives, which may serve as a model for other rural communities facing similar barriers to healthcare access. My co-contributors were Heather Mountz and Dr. Donna Biederman." Hardison added that, "The conference provided valuable opportunities to exchange ideas with nursing educators, researchers, and community health leaders from across the nation. There was significant interest in rural telehealth models, community-academic partnerships, workforce development, and innovative approaches to improving healthcare access. The presentation generated meaningful discussion about strategies that can help bridge healthcare gaps in rural communities." Hardison's participation in the conference was entirely funded through a Duke University School of Nursing HRSA grant. "To my knowledge, I am the only community partner who has received this opportunity through the grant." The partnership between Duke University has been a highly beneficial one to Pamlico County. Through the Duke University Global Health Institute, Duke University School of Nursing, and Duke University School of Medicine, our community has received more than \$400,000 in in-kind contributions. In addition, the Duke University School of Nursing has provided more than \$200,000 in grant sub-awards to support telehealth equipment, infrastructure, and related initiatives that improve access to healthcare services in our rural community. "Our residents have benefited greatly from these academic partnerships," says Hardison. "Through collaboration with Duke University and other academic institutions, the Pamlico County Health Department Clinic has been able to expand healthcare services, including primary care and telehealth. These initiatives have significantly increased access to care in a rural community facing provider shortages and barriers to health and wellness. By providing local access to preventive, primary, and telehealth services, these programs help reduce barriers such as travel, improve continuity of care, and lessen the burden on hospital emergency departments by addressing healthcare needs before they become emergencies." She added, "The support received through these partnerships has strengthened our local healthcare infrastructure, enhanced educational opportunities for future healthcare professionals, and improved health outcomes for residents throughout the county. These contributions have enabled the clinic to provide an Advanced Practice Provider 40 hours per week, obtain in-network status with Medicaid, Medicare, and private insurance plans, and expand access to reimbursable healthcare services. These reimbursement revenues help offset operational costs and reduce the financial burden on county taxpayers while maintaining access to essential healthcare services for our community." Another excellent example of your Pamlico County Health Department working for you.

Summer pool party safety



A backyard pool opens the door to an endless source of summertime memories. There may be no better place to gather when the sun is shining and the heat is blazing than the cooling waters of a backyard pool. Although a pool can be an enjoyable and relaxing home feature, it also carries significant responsibilities.

Recent findings from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission show that drowning and submersions among children remain high. In 2020, 339 children younger than age 15 fatally drowned, and in 2021, that figure rose by 12 percent. Young children (age 5 and under) represent 75 percent of child drowning deaths and 77 percent of nonfatal injuries.

Pool safety concerns and drowning incidents are largely preventable. By staying up-to-date on safety standards and being vigilant when hosting others, people can ensure that the pool remains a place to relax and have fun.

Create physical barriers

Modern safety standards require separating the pool from the neighbors and the rest of the home and yard. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention say a fence that is at least four feet tall that completely surrounds the water can reduce a child's drowning risk by up to 83 percent, compared to three-sided property-line fencing. Gates should be self-closing and self-latching, and entry-

ways to the pool should swing outward away from the water. New smart lock technology can alert homeowners if a gate is left open.

Visual supervision

No technology can replace a human. Someone should be enlisted to watch the water anytime someone is swimming, and especially when larger crowds during a party will be using the pool. The person should have no phone, book or other distractions, and should remain sober. The CPSC suggests this "water watcher" handle the task for a set period of time and then can be rotated out. Those hosting a party may want to hire a lifeguard, even if they have an above-ground pool, to ensure the safety of all swimmers.

Establish firm rules

While pools can be fun, it's essential that everyone behave safely when in and around the water. Party hosts can set rules, such as no running or diving. People may consider removing large floats or extra toys from the pool water, which can hinder sight lines and mask someone floundering or drowning. Additional rules may prohibit drinking alcoholic beverages and swimming, or having separate swim times for children and adults, as larger adults might overwhelm the pool and make swimming more challenging for younger swimmers.

Keep safety gear nearby

Rescue equipment, such as a shepherd's hook and a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life ring, should be poolside at all times. At least one person in the household should be trained in CPR. Survival rates and neurological outcomes for drowning victims improve considerably when CPR can be administered immediately, says the American Heart Association.

Planning a pool party requires more than making sure water chemicals are balanced and there are refreshments available. Ensuring that swimmers remain safe should be the utmost priority.

Backyard ideas on a budget

Many people enjoy the possibilities that outdoor living offers and admit they would spend more time outside if the exterior spaces of their homes featured more amenities. According to a 2024 survey by Allstate Protection Plans, Americans love outdoor living and entertaining. 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SUMMERTIME HYDRATION STRATEGIES

- Look to foods to stay hydrated. Drinking water isn't the only way to ensure you stay hydrated. Various foods are loaded with water. Henry Ford Health® notes that watermelon, berries, bell peppers, and grapes are water-rich foods that can help you stay hydrated.

Dehydration can creep up on hot summer days and put people in serious jeopardy. That's why it's imperative that people make a concerted effort to hydrate and do not wait until they're thirsty to enjoy a glass of water on a hot summer day.

SIGNS YOUR DOG MAY BE DEHYDRATED

Water is essential for mammals' bodies to operate at peak capacity. The American Kennel Club says water is necessary to lubricate joints, facilitate digestion, regulate body temperature, and cushion internal organs, among many other functions. Similar to humans, pets that fail to consume enough water can face dire consequences.



Dehydration is a medical term for when the body has lost more fluid than it has taken in. Dehydration can occur at any time, but it is even more common during the warm weather months. Dogs quickly can become very sick from dehydration. That is why every pet owner should learn how to recognize the symptoms of dehydration in their dogs.

The Veterinary Emergency Group says symptoms of mild dehydration can include:

- Dry nose, although this also can be a signal of other problems, like fever.
- Excessive drooling occurs as the dog tries to cool down its body.
- A dehydrated dog can exhibit signs of fatigue, including a reluctance to move around much.
- Sticky gums

As the dog becomes more dehydrated, the following symptoms can develop:

- Loss of elasticity of the skin.
- Loss of appetite.
- Thickening of the dog's saliva.
- Gums may go from sticky to dry.
- Excessive panting may begin.
- Vomiting or diarrhea also may occur.
- Dehydration causes the body to redistribute fluid lost, and fluid may be pulled from the eyes, causing the eyes to appear sunken.

If a dog appears to be dehydrated, you can start offering small amounts of water to slowly rehydrate the animal, says Northeast Veterinary Referral Hospital. It's important to call the veterinarian and get further advice regarding how to address dehydration. Some vets may suggest offering an electrolyte-enhanced fluid like Pedialyte so electrolyte loss does not affect organs. The vet may want you to come into the office so the dog can receive intravenous fluids, says the American Kennel Club.

The best way to treat dehydration is to prevent it in the first place. Provide dogs with a constant supply of clean, clear water at all times. The amount of water needs to increase if the dog is spending time outdoors in hot weather or exercising.

Cats also are prone to dehydration and can exhibit the same symptoms as dogs. So cat owners also must be diligent in checking for dehydration symptoms in their pets.

This past Saturday, we took a stroll through the Blueberry Festival, in Bridgeton. It was certainly a hot one, but the family-friendly

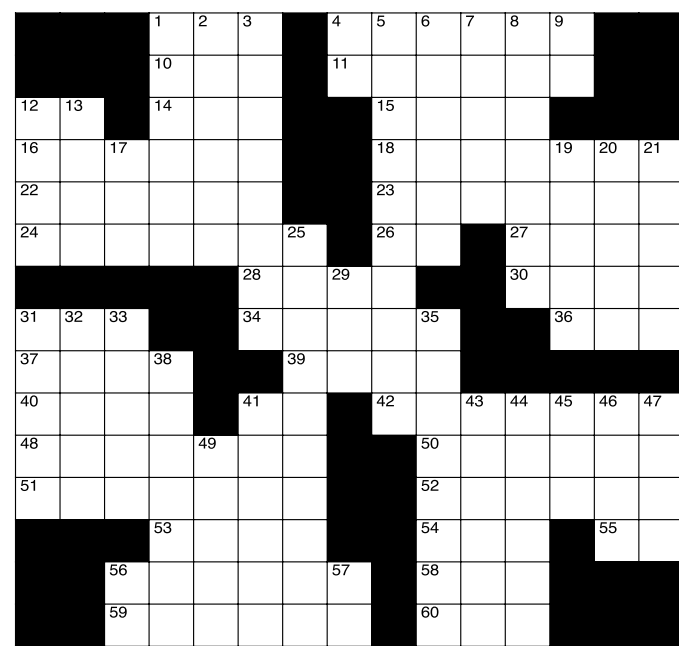
