At school, I had already come to know his twin brother, Isaiah, who had been with us the entire year. But I did not meet Isaac until his medical team approved him to return to school for half days.

And I will never forget it.

What stood out to me was not everything Isaac had endured, but the attitude he carried with him through it all. After spending years unable to experience school the way most students do, all Isaac wanted was to be back in the classroom, back in the hallways, and back alongside his classmates again. Something many of us take for granted was something he deeply valued.

There are some people who inspire others because of extraordinary talent or achievement. Others inspire simply by refusing to give up, even when life gives them every reason to.

For Isaac, there have been days when just making it to school required tremendous effort. And yet, he shows up. He puts a smile on his face. He doesn't complain. And, he treats others with kindness and carries himself with a quiet determination.

He has reminded me over and over again, that courage is not always loud or attention-seeking. Sometimes, it looks like persistence. Sometimes, it looks like grace. And sometimes, it looks like walking through the doors each day with a positive spirit despite the challenges you carry.

Tonight, it is my honor to recognize Isaac Rodriguez with the Principal's "Heart of a Hurricane" Award for showing us what courage looks like in action. For showing us that our challenges don't define who we are.

Isaac, you have touched this school community more than you may ever know. Congratulations.
